

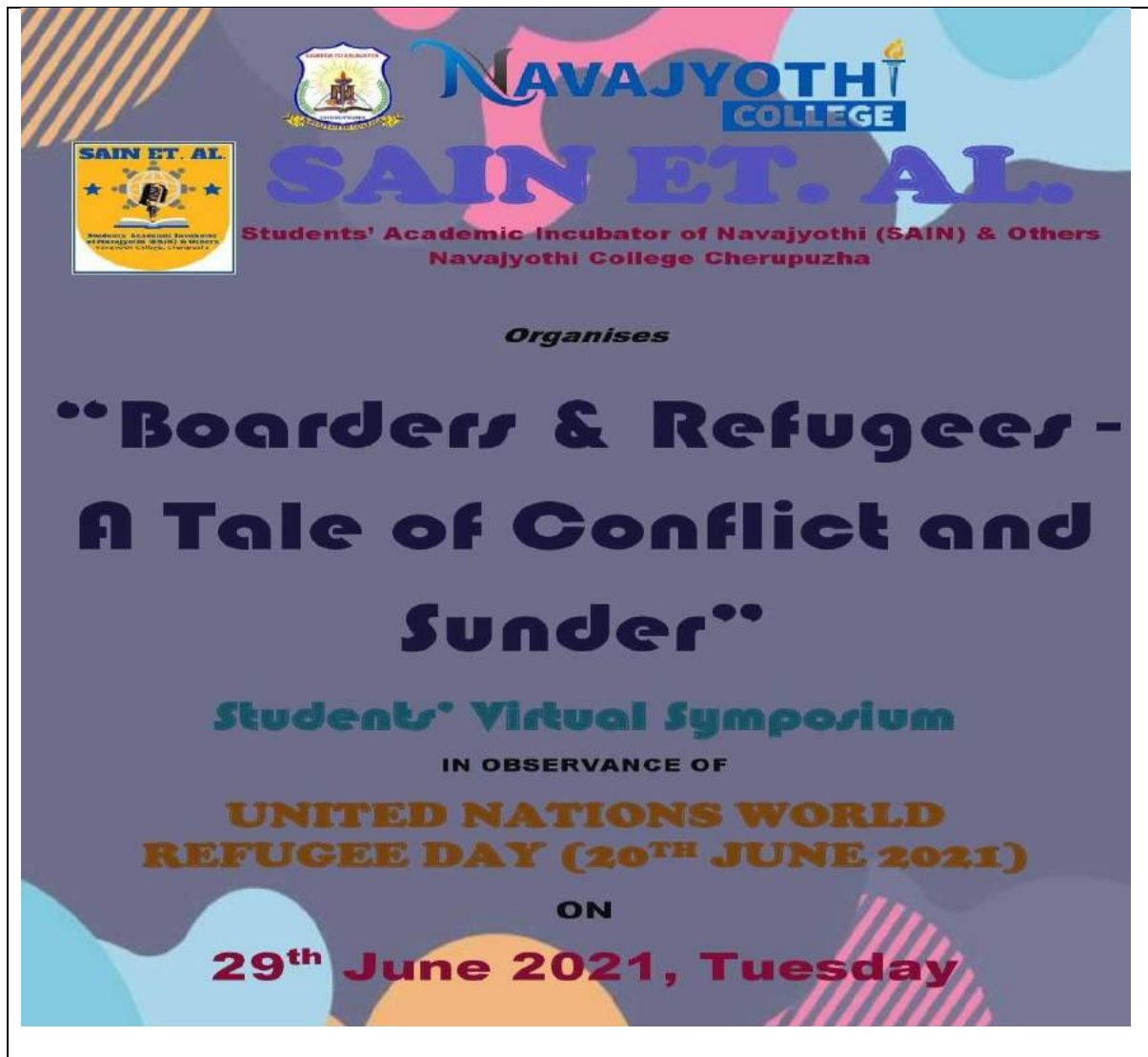


SAIN et al. 2020-21

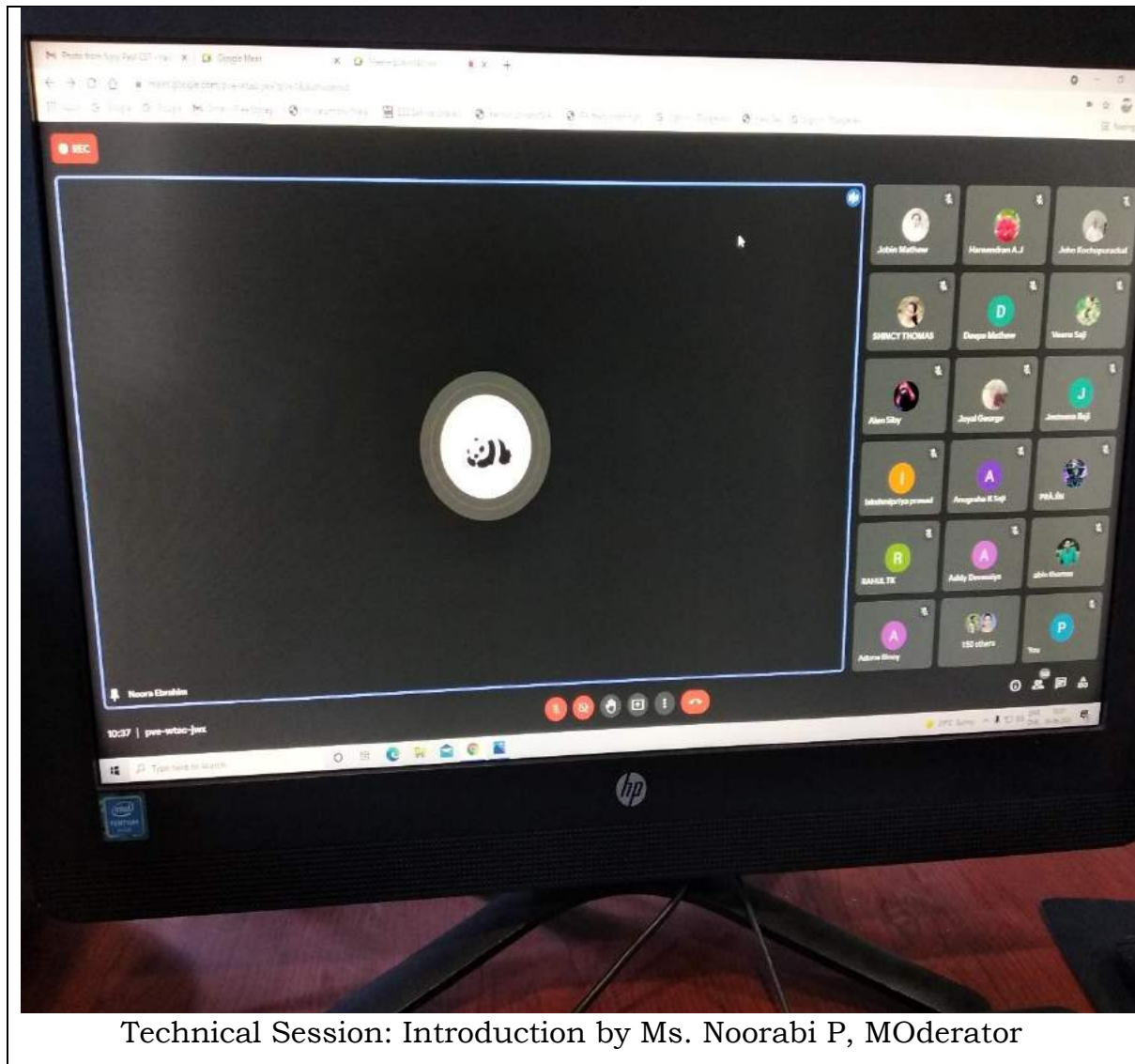

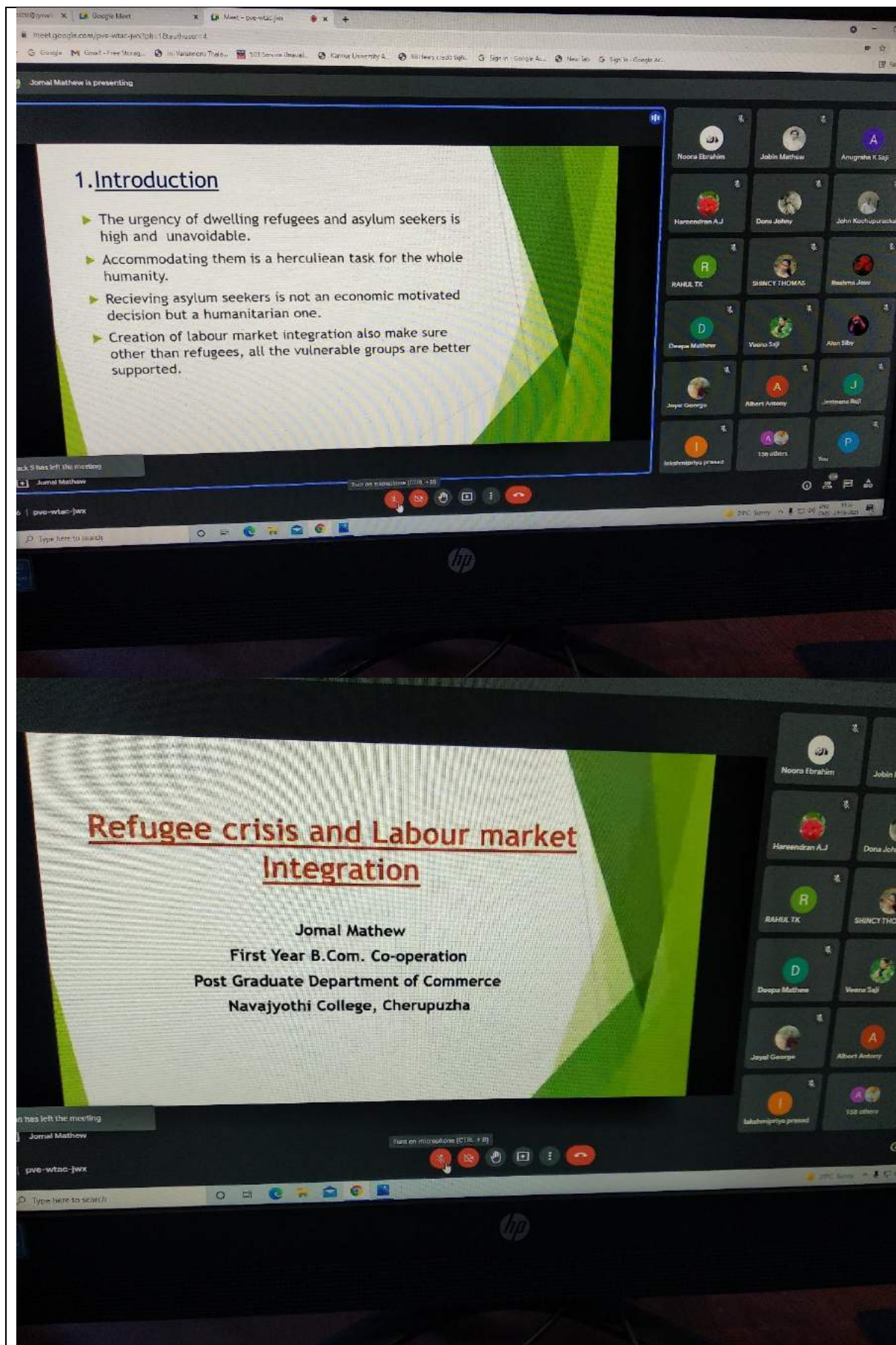

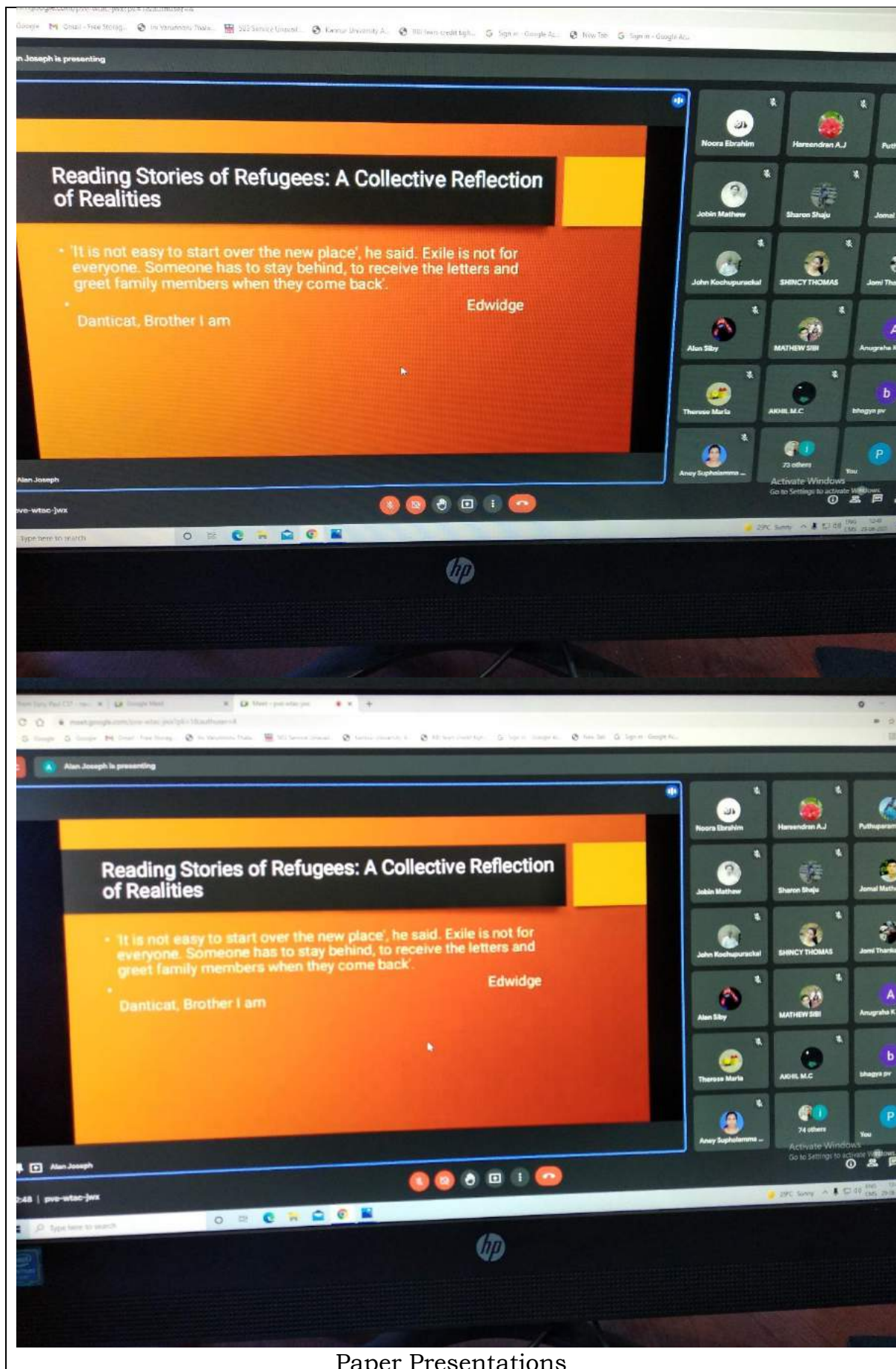
